Changes for 2023 Show Season

- Five scheduled shows instead of six
- 4H group to set up panels at Shelbyville
- New Cattle Providers
- Nine New Judges
- No refund of cattle fees for scratched classes
- Membership and Show Fees Increase
- Three trail patterns
 - 13&Under
 - Open & Non Pro
 - Junior Horse, 14-18 Youth, Novice NP, Non-Nominated
- Adding Possible Challenge Trail obstacle of riding through live cattle in pen
- Eliminated Reined Cow Horse Division
- Consolidated Novice & Amateur back to Novice Non-Pro (NNP)
 - Returned to Previous NNP criteria
 - NNP regular Sort & Pen and Boxing on short wall
- Youth & NNP Trail Classes scheduled (rest at will)
- 14-18 Youth Roping Exhibition class (no points)
- Revised Ranch Cutting Herd Work only two cows, two minutes, no pen
- Eliminated in Hand Classes
- Change in the order classes will go
- No Crossover between Non Nominated and Nominated classes
- Eliminated the first circle whistle in working cowhorse
- Added a medical exception process

Basis for Setting Show Fees

- Historical Data on Fees
 - Class fees remained the same from 2009-2019
 - Youth Class fees have remained the same since 2009
 - In 2020, riding classes increased by \$3 (except youth classes)
- Things to consider
 - Fixed Costs make up 65% of the expenses
 - Regardless of the number of entries, the majority of the costs must be covered
 - Expenses impacting the need to increase fees:
 - Going from six to five shows and maintaining quality year end awards
 - Cattle Provider Change
 - Increase in staff expenses including judges fees
 - Increase in costs of supplies, equipment and awards



2023 Show Fee Changes



- Memberships increased by \$10 (Family \$35; Individual \$25)
- Riding Classes Increased \$5 per class
 - Open (from \$17 to \$22); Non-Nominated (from \$15 to \$22)
 - Non Pro, Novice and Junior Horse (from \$15 to \$20)
- Cattle Charges Increased \$9 per class (from \$25 to \$34)
 - Scratched cattle classes will be charged the \$34 cattle fee
- All Youth Classes will have a charge per class fee
 - The youth package was eliminated
- Office Fee increased by \$8 per entry (from \$7 to \$15)
- Division Class Fee Increases (if entry is for all classes in the division)
 - Open, Non-Pro increased by \$65 for the day
 - Novice and Junior Horse increased by \$65 for the day
 - Non-Nominated Classes fees now match Open Class fees (with no payout)
 - Both Youth Divisions were able to show all day for \$75 (\$67.50 with discount)
 - 2022 per class charges totaled \$101 (priced individually)
 - 2023 per class charges will total \$143 (priced individually)
 - Riding Class \$15
 - Cattle Class \$49 (\$15+\$34)
